Flooding in Kentucky Update

On July 28, 2022 Eastern Kentucky counties of Letcher, Perry, Knott, and Breathitt experienced a historic flood where over 35 people lost their lives, and hundreds lost everything they owned. Laurel mission was located 25 miles from the nearest flood area and suffered no flood damage. FEMA, Red Cross, and other major relief entities are helping the people living in these counties.

What can we do to help our brothers and sisters?

1. We can remember them in our daily prayers. On a personal note, please remember Lindsey, Nathan's wife, for her two cousins Angel and Nicole lost all their possessions. Each of them have 3 children
2. Many supplies are needed from shovels, hygiene items, to food. Laurel Mission can purchase many these items at a discount price if they travel to Lexington. If you wish to contribute money for supplies, place your money in the brown envelope located in the pew pocket. If writing a check, make the check out to Prince Street Church and in the memo write Flood Relief. All money will be used to help the people living in these flooded counties.
3. We will be collecting boots and shoes to send to these areas. If you have some good used boots or sneakers, please consider donating them to distribute to those who have none. We will take them along with us on our mission trip in September. Place your donation in the boxes provided at the back of our sanctuary by Sunday, September 18. 150-200 of these would be a great give away. All sizes taken, many children are without shoes too.
